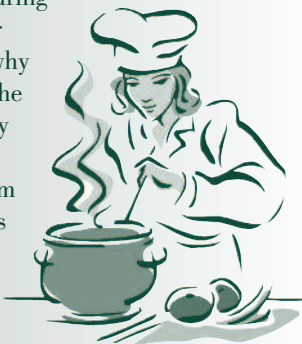

The Last Station - 2009

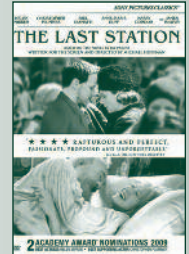

This film focuses on the last few months of the novelist and writer Leo Tolstoy's family and social life. It stars Christopher Plummer as Tolstoy, Helen Mirren as his wife Sophya, James McAvoy as Tolstoy's new personal secretary Valentin, Kerry Condon as Valentin's charming and aggressive love interest, and Paul Giamatti as the leader of a group of "Tolstoyans" who wish to widely promote Tolstoy's ideals. The film is set in early 20th century Russia, before the harsh realities of the Russian Revolution occurred in 1917 and thereafter (Tolstoy died in 1910). It was a time in history when Socialism was still an untried idealized conceptual form of government, and Tolstoy in his final years became more "radical" in his political, religious, and social philosophies.

The theme raises two universal questions. What do you do when the love of your life is in conflict with your highest priority ideals? And how does your treatment or mistreatment of the people closest to you, who have loved and cared for you the most, reflect on the quality of your ideals? Please join us for this sweet, yet powerfully provocative film screening.

JANUARY - Luminous, eclectic landscape paintings by artist/musician PATRICIA OSBORNE FEILER

Artist's opening reception Saturday, January 8th from 3:00 to 5:00 pm

Patricia Osborne Feiler has been a fixture in the Quogue community for over thirty-five years as organist and children's choir director at the Church of Atonement. She has also been piano accompanist for numerous Quogue Junior Theater Troupe productions.

In 2008, Patricia completed a commissioned painting for the 125th Anniversary of The Church of Atonement in Quogue. The 24" x 36" oil painting depicting the 4th of July SS 100th Anniversary Celebration at Westhampton Yacht Squadron hangs in the church rectory. In 2010 the church commissioned a second painting, this one of The Church of Atonement in commemoration of the retirement of the Right Reverend Robert C. Witcher.



Her eclectic paintings reflect the luminous colors of Long Island's landscape. Her

family has a rich tradition in writing, music and art. Generations of family artists trace back to political cartoonist Thomas Nast. During college and throughout her thirty-three year career as a

music educator in the Eastport and Southold Public Schools, Patricia continued her passionate study of art. Among her teachers is Caleb Nelson Carter, LIAFA founder Robert Armetta and renowned Swiss artist Garance Wertmuller.

She is presently a teaching artist at the WHB Performing Arts Center and an active member of the East End Arts Council. Her work has been widely exhibited in several venues including the East End Arts Council Gallery Juried Shows, Southold Town Hall, Cutchogue Library, Martha Clara Vineyard and the Mattituck-Laurel Library Gallery. Her studio is located in the Donald Feiler Architect Building.

Patricia lives in Mattituck with her husband Donald.

The exhibit will be on view from January 5th to February 2nd.

FEBRUARY - 6th ANNUAL JURIED HIGH SCHOOL ART CONTEST

Awards Ceremony Reception – Tuesday, February 8th at 6:00 pm

For the sixth year in a row, the Art Gallery at the Quogue Library will sponsor an art contest in conjunction with Westhampton Beach High School beginning February 5th and continuing throughout the month until March 4th. The contest will give high school students residing in the Westhampton Beach School District who attend either public or private schools the opportunity to display their talents to the public and experience the taste and excitement of real gallery participation.

This event is in keeping with the mission of the Quogue Library to support and nurture the arts among young people in our community.

The theme of this year's contest is "Contradictions" which will encourage a wide interpretation for the student artists to express their creativity in works of realism, modern and mixed media presentations.

Judges for the contest are Pat Snyder, Executive Director of the East End Arts Council; Richard Mizdal, Associate Professor of Photographic Imaging at Suffolk Community College; and Pat Rogers, Arts and Culture Journalist covering East End publications and on-line media. All selected works will be judged and prizes will be awarded as follows: First Place \$100; Second Place \$50 and Third Place \$25. All entrants will be given a certificate of participation. In addition there will be certificate awards for sub-groups such as Best Watercolor and Theme Interpretation to acknowledge the expression, creativity and range of techniques to students whose works were not otherwise chosen for the main awards, but are worthy of distinction.

To facilitate the success of this event, Anne St. John, Art Chair of Westhampton Beach High School is working in collaboration with Elizabeth Platé, Art Gallery Committee member and Chair of the event.

As in the past, this is a very exciting event for our community and we at the library are very proud to sponsor it.
