OIL PAINTINGS AND MURALS  
by Award-Winning Artist/Musician  
FRANK LATORRE

*Artists' Reception: Saturday, July 3 from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m.*



Frank Latorre is a multi-talented lifetime artist. A self-taught painter, sculptor and guitarist, he has been working as a professional for 35 years ever since the early 70s when he first picked up an airbrush. His creativity extends from airbrush paintings of cars and motorcycles, for which he has won several awards, to hand-cut designs on sandblasted glass and mirrors, which are now in private homes and permanent fixtures in restaurants. His oil paintings cover a variety of subjects including bold portraits, poetic seascapes and nature, all in a realistic, academic technique. A prolific painter, he also creates interior wall murals, many of which employ the trompe l'oeil technique involving realistic imagery that makes a two-dimensional painting appear to be three-dimensional. His work has received broad press exposure including *The New York Times*, *Newsday* and *The Southampton Press*, as well as TV coverage on *News 12* and *CNN*. Most recently his work was on the cover of *Dan's Papers*.

As a gifted musician, Frank Latorre, is an accomplished guitarist who performs soulful renderings with his original blues band, *The King Bees*, in several venues on the East End.

The ultimate expression of Frank Latorre's passion for all art is his Art & Soul Gallery in Eastport where he exhibits, in addition to his own works, the paintings and sculpture of professional artists and also hosts a number of art classes. He believes that art is vital to human existence and may be needed even more in the worst of times.

In further describing his beliefs he said, "Art is like religion. When I pick up the brush, I pray."

His work will be on display until July 30.

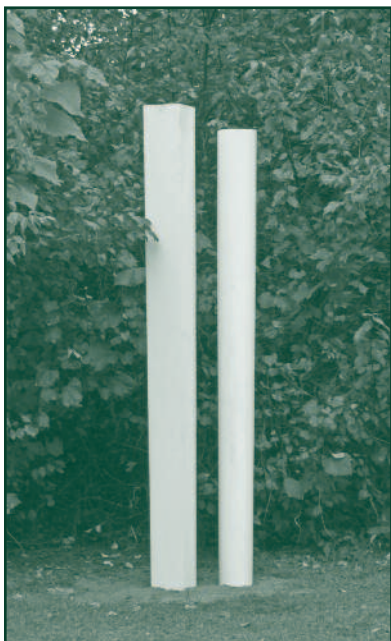
## AUGUST – MINIMAL ABSTRACT SCULPTURE

by International and East End Artist AVITAL OZ

**Artists' Reception: Saturday, August 7 from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m.**

Avital Oz's small scale models as well as his somewhat large scale sculptures will be on display inside the art gallery and will also dot the library grounds during the month of August.

“Marrying opposites in form and materials, the works are wildly expressive in terms of movement, yet the simplicity of the forms grants them an atmosphere of restraint that is both elegant and arresting. Avital Oz's work creates a subtle sense of syncopation as the viewer's eyes move along the work. They contrast organic (granite, marble and wood) with more industrial materials (copper, zinc and steel) and show the raw power of sculpture but are also able to retain a whimsical and rhythmic quality to them.”

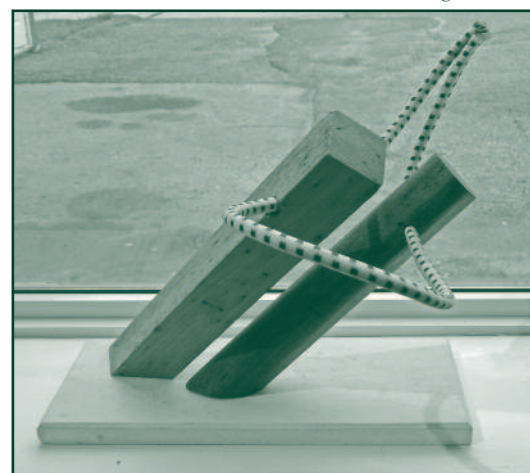
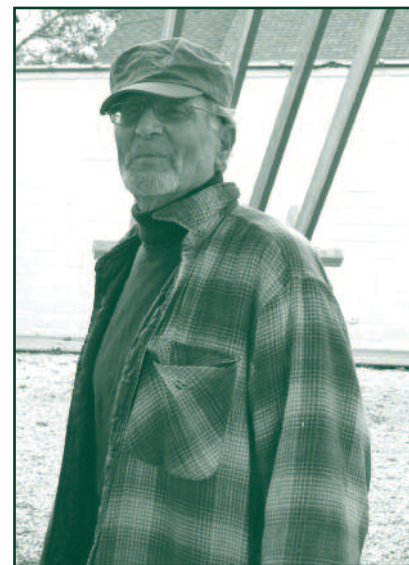
Avital Oz was born in Palestine in 1942 and raised and educated in kibbutz Mishmar Ha'emek, Israel. He served in the military before he enrolled in Anvi Institute for Fine Arts in Tel Aviv. In 1967, he left Israel to study at the National Academy of Fine Arts in Mexico City and The School of Visual Arts in NYC. Oz went on to earn both his B.F.A. and M.F.A. from Yale University School of Art and Architecture in 1973. He taught at Parsons and The New School and has completed many private and public commissions. His work has been displayed regularly at the Elaine Benson Gallery in Bridgehampton and the O.K. Harris Gallery in Soho, NYC as well as in numerous solo and group exhibitions in the U.S. and abroad.

Oz's most recent exhibition at Art Sites in Riverhead was a powerful display of almost 50 of his pieces on view in the gallery and outdoors across a two acre site which spanned the last 40 years of his career. A *New York Times* review of that exhibit stated, “Mr. Oz has proven that minimal abstract sculpture is far from defunct and that artists continue to make interesting and innovative work in this vein.”

The sculpture of Avital Oz will be on exhibit from July 31 through August 30.
