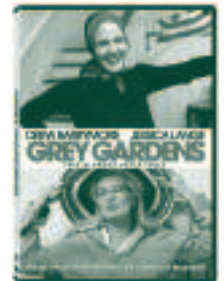
Grey Gardens 2009 – including an introduction by Director Michael Sucsy

In 1973, filmmakers Albert and David Maysles entered the strange world of "Big Edie" and "Little Edie" Bouvier Beale, two charming eccentrics who were relatives of Jacqueline Bouvier Kennedy. Spending six weeks with the reclusive mother and daughter who chose to live in squalor and almost total isolation in a decaying, 28-room mansion in East Hampton, the Maysles captured their day-to-day life in its raw, uncensored, captivatingly honest moments for a documentary entitled "Grey Gardens." Little did anyone know that the 100-minute documentary would catapult the two women from virtual obscurity to cult status as their legacy grew in depth and stature over the years.

Thirty-five years later, using the documentary as a framework, director-writer Michael Sucsy's original story for **GREY GARDENS** offers a wry, behind-the-scenes look at the Beales and their unique mother-daughter bond.

Told over the span of four decades, the film focuses on their glamorous and well-heeled lives long before the making of the documentary and on the circumstances behind their riches-to-rags story.

The Quogue Library is pleased to announce a new service, *SuffolkWave*, which cardholders can use to download a variety of digital media to their home computers.

A cooperative project involving Suffolk County public libraries, the Suffolk Cooperative Library System, and Overdrive Inc., *SuffolkWave* is accessed from the library’s webpage at www.quoguelibrary.org and allows library patrons to download audio books, music, and video to their home computers, which then may be transferred to many popular portable devices. Patrons will need a valid library card, broadband access to the Internet, and a home computer to access *SuffolkWave* materials. A one-time free download of OverDrive Media Console is required to use the downloaded files.

This service is intended for home use and is not available on library computers.

Summer Reading Program registration begins on **Saturday, July 4.**
The **Summer Reading Program** will end on **Saturday, August 22.**

An adult must accompany children to the library to assist with the registration process.

Children ages four and older, who are Quogue or East Quogue residents, are encouraged to obtain a library card when they sign up for the summer reading program.

All children must bring their books to the library when reporting on them!
Come into the library to report on books after reading and/or listening to three stories.

Please note: Summer Reading Program reporting will not take place one hour prior, and one half hour after, scheduled children's programs.

Reading logs are to be kept by children and shared with their teachers when they go back to school in September.
Please do not leave them at the library!

Pennies for Peace

During the months of July and August, children are encouraged to participate in the *Pennies for Peace* campaign. Inspired by Greg Mortenson's quest to build schools for children in the remote regions of Afghanistan and Pakistan, and recounted in the books *Three Cups of Tea* and *Listen to the Wind*, we ask children to be philanthropists by donating their pennies this summer.

Pennies seem to be everywhere, yet they don't buy much in our country. In Pakistan and Afghanistan a penny buys a pencil and opens the door to literacy. The opportunity for an education gives the children of these countries a chance to break the cycle of poverty, terrorism, and war.

How many pennies can you collect? Look for stray pennies in your couch, in the car, and on the street. Then bring them to the library and drop them in our *Pennies for Peace* container, located at the entrance to the children's room. In September we will tally all the pennies collected and send our donation to the Central Asia Institute.

JULY – ORIGINAL CONCEPTUAL DRAWINGS OF RALPH LAUREN FASHIONS

Opening Reception: Saturday, July 11 from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m.

The Art Gallery Committee is privileged to be the first gallery in New York to showcase the extraordinary fashion art of Audrey Schilt, former Creative Director, V.P. of Collection of Polo/Ralph Lauren where she has worked for 22 years.

After graduating from the Fashion Institute of Technology, in New York City, she got her introduction to the fashion-design world working for Halston as a sketch artist just as he was beginning his ascent to fame. Thus began her 30 year career of sketching and designing for some of the most revered names in fashion history. She joined Ralph Lauren as conceptual artist and eventually was named Creative Director, V.P. of Collection. She worked side by side with Lauren as he built his fashion empire, helping him to interpret and illustrate his creative ideas.

Highlights from her tenure with Lauren include collaboration on the now famous pink silk gown Gwyneth Paltrow wore to the 1998 Academy Awards. She has sketched dresses for Princess Diana, Oprah, Julia Roberts and numerous other celebrities.

Other achievements include having her sketch chosen as the cover image for the book Lauren published in 2006 titled *Diary of a Collection*, having several of her fashion drawings featured in Lauren's 40th anniversary book *Ralph Lauren*, and having her sketches featured as part of the window displays of one of Japan's largest department stores.

Now retired from her position at Ralph Lauren, Schilt is turning her attention to other artistic endeavors, as she continues to be available as a designer on a consultant basis. With an impressive career behind her, Schilt is looking toward the future as a place for a fresh start. "There's something still inside of me, so much I still want to create," the artist says. "This is just the beginning."

This unique show will include a large number of framed working drawings, by Schilt, that are one-of-a-kind collectibles enabling one to own a piece of Ralph Lauren's vision. To aid in understanding the process, a series of illustrative posters will give viewers a glimpse into Ralph Lauren's world. From conceptual design meetings, to fabrics and fittings, the creative process and glamour of the industry will be presented to the public through this remarkable exhibit. The show will run from Wednesday, July 1st to Wednesday, July 29, 2009.

Constance Beaty was educated at The Brearley School, The Phillips Exeter Academy, and was trained in ballet at the American Ballet Theatre School. Later she attended Yale University, where she graduated cum laude with a degree in French Literature.



After graduating from Yale, Beaty pursued an acting career in which she was honored to work on and off Broadway, on television and in regional theatres with such luminaries as Jessica Tandy, Glenda Jackson, Geraldine Page, Bette Davis and many more. However, eventually she decided to pursue another talent in the field of figurative art. She studied drawing and painting at Parsons School of Design, The New School and the Art Student's League. Her principal influences, however, were Ronald Sherr, Mary Beth MacKenzie and Harvey Dinnerstein at the National Academy of Design School, where she was the recipient of several awards including the John Young-Hunter Memorial Award.

Beaty accompanied her husband Peter McCormick, a foreign correspondent, to Managua, Nicaragua, where she lived and painted for two years and was appointed house portraitist for the weekly cultural magazine *Gente*. Upon her return to the United States in 1990, she set up a studio and has been painting commissioned portraits and landscapes ever since. Her most interesting among over fifty portrait commissions, include an official portrait of the Honorable Ruth Bader Ginsburg, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court. She also had the pleasure of painting U.S. Senator Patrick Leahy (D.-Vt.). Her paintings may be found in the collections of Kitty Carlisle Hart, Arnold Scaasi, The Phillips Exeter Academy and Yale University, among others.

It is interesting to note that Constance Beaty is also a member of the third generation of an extremely talented artistic family. Her brother, Adam Guettel has recently been noted for his musical theatre pieces *The Ballad of Floyd Collins*, *Myths and Hymns*, and most recently, *Light in the Piazza*. Her mother, Mary Rodgers, is the composer of the Broadway musical *Once Upon a Mattress* and the author of the popular children's book and film *Freaky Friday*. Her late grandfather, Richard Rodgers, is renowned as one of this country's greatest theatrical composers for the scores he wrote with Oscar Hammerstein II of (among many others) *Oklahoma!*, *South Pacific*, *The Sound of Music*; his myriad standard songs such as *Funny Valentine* and *Blue Moon* written in partnership with Lorenz Hart; as well as other orchestral compositions such as *Victory at Sea* and *Slaughter on Tenth Avenue*.
