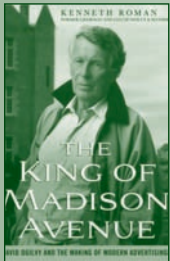
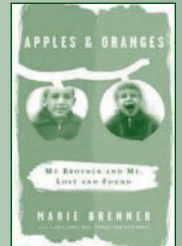


July 5 - Molly Haskell

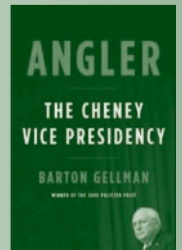


July 12 - Kenneth Roman

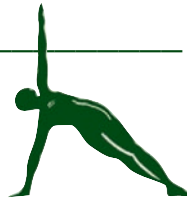

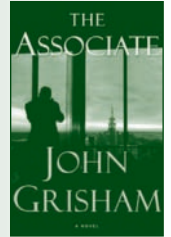
Don't see your favorite title on the shelf? Well, most titles are available fairly quickly now! So – if you don't find what you are looking for – stop by our circulation desk to make your request.

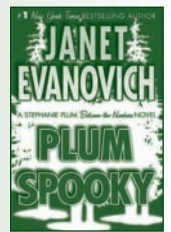

Un Coeur en Hiver 1992
 (A Heart in Winter) French Language Film
 Saturday, March 21
 Feast 6:30 p.m. • Film 7:15 p.m.

Daniel Auteuil (*Manon of the Spring*) plays Stephane, the curiously diffident co-owner of an exclusive violin brokerage and repair shop. A brilliant technician, Stephane can make any instrument live up to its promise, yet he is emotionally remote himself, disconnected from passionate experience. His partner, Maxime (André Dussollier), lacks Stephane's gifts but is rich in personality and desire. When Maxime's new lover, a violinist named Camille (Emmanuelle Béart), is drawn to Stephane's still waters, the latter is briefly moved, thus destroying the fragile, symbiotic relationship between all three individuals. Veteran French filmmaker Claude Sautet (of the Oscar-winning *César et Rosalie*) has made a powerful film here expressed in the smallest of gestures, just as one might tune the strings of a violin ever-so-slightly to achieve perfection. Sautet indeed employs such a sonorous motif in this story, in which violins always seem to be playing and suggesting that the principal characters look at life as they do music: something to be tinkered with and manipulated for effect.

The plot of this classic film centers around a con-ning father and daughter – who meet up with the heir to a brewery fortune-a wealthy but naïve snake enthusiast-and attempt to bamboozle him at a cruise ship card table. Their plan is quickly abandoned when the daughter falls in love with their prey. But when the heir gets wise to her gold-digging ways, she must plot to re-conquer his heart. One of Sturges' most clever and beloved romantic comedies, *The Lady Eve* starring Barbara Stanwyck, balances broad slapstick and sophisticated sexiness with perfect grace.

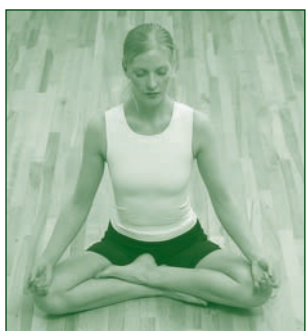

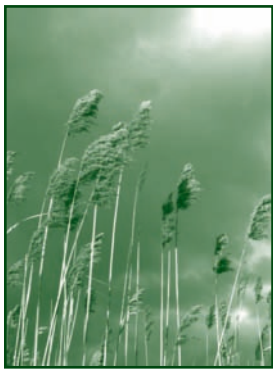
ART GALLERY NEWS!

MARCH – DRAMATIC SKIES OF LONG ISLAND

Extraordinarily serene to fiery skies depicted by photographic artist MARK DAVIS

Artist's Reception – Saturday, March 7 from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m.

Mark Davis, a relative newcomer to Long Island, born in Brooklyn, moved to Long Island in 2007, where he became fascinated with the beautiful skies. Having dabbled in painting as a pre-teen, he didn't seriously pick up art materials again until the early 1990's, eventually painting portraits of his dogs and then many self-portraits. This was then followed by larger, more abstract works, and since that time he has exhibited his works in several venues in New Jersey, Pennsylvania and New York. Among his collectors are a former officer of Sotheby's, a director of *Art Forum Magazine* and a curator of the Chelsea Art Museum. Photo works of Mark's were in the Leslie-Lohman Art Foundation's Photo Biennial and were selected for inclusion in the "1000 Words" exhibit in New Jersey, the New Jersey Institute of Technology and the Cathedral Arts Festival at Grace Church Van Vorst in Jersey City. His is the winner of several prestigious awards including one for his painting "Passion" by the *Artist's Magazine*.



In 2007, one of Mark's photographs was chosen by the Long Island Center of Photography for exhibition at their show in Hempstead and the Center chose three of his photographs for their exhibition at the African-American Museum.

Using a digital camera to achieve the effects he envisions, Mark's photographs are often poetic and at times spiritual. He believes essentially that art, all art, is a means of communication and that differences supposed between abstraction and realism are false and arbitrary as are differences between painting and photography. In this theory, paints, canvas or other grounds, brushes, palette knives, cameras, lenses, film, digital media, etc., are all just tools, simply means to an artful end.

After a long and successful career as a creative director and graphic designer, Roxanne Panero resumed artistic studies at the Long Island Academy of Fine Art in Riverhead. Demonstrated in this exhibit of drawings and paintings is an evolution of style that ranges from traditional academic observations done from life to more conceptual and abstract imagery.



After graduating from the fine arts department at Barry College in Miami, Florida, Roxanne taught painting and design at Barry College and Miami Dade Junior College. Upon moving to New York City, Roxanne was Vice President and Creative Director of R. L. Silver Associates, an advertising agency, for 14 years. She then began her own design firm, Panero Design, Inc. which is in operation today.

She taught typography and design at Fashion Institute of Technology in NYC for ten years. Throughout her career, she continued studies at the School of Visual Arts, Pratt Institute and the Long Island Academy of Fine Art.



Roxanne has served as juror for No-Load Mutual Fund Association's annual Graphic Design Awards; panelist for Logo and Brand Development, IAAPA; juror for 2007 Congressional Art Show and been the recipient of numerous design awards in the print industry, including being named *Graphic Designer of the Year* by the Long Island Arts Council.

Her work has received "Best in Show" awards from juried shows at the East End Arts Council several times. It has also been widely exhibited on Long Island including Guild Hall, Artists Alliance of East Hampton and the Crazy Monkey Gallery as well as included in several private collections.
