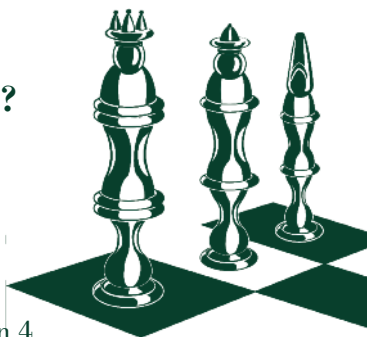

***Those Who Save Us*  
by Jenna Blum**

For fifty years, Anna Schlemmer has refused to talk about her life in Germany during World War II. Her daughter, Trudy, was only three when she and her mother were liberated by an American soldier and went to live with him in Minnesota. Trudy's sole evidence of the past is an old photograph: a family portrait showing Anna, Trudy, and a Nazi officer, the Obersturmfuhrer of Buchenwald. Driven by the guilt of her heritage, Trudy, now a professor of German history, begins investigating the past and finally unearths the dramatic and heartbreaking truth of her mother's life. Combining a passionate, doomed love story, a vivid evocation of life during the war, and a poignant mother/daughter drama, *Those Who Save Us* is a profound exploration of what we endure to survive and the legacy of shame.

Vince Rizzo (Andy Garcia) is a lifelong resident of the tiny, tradition-steeped Bronx enclave of City Island. A family man who makes his living as a corrections officer, Vince longs to become an actor.

Ashamed to admit his aspirations to his family, Vince would rather let his fiery wife Joyce (Julianna Margulies) believe his weekly poker games are a cover for an extramarital affair than admit he's secretly taking acting classes in Manhattan. When Vince is asked to reveal his biggest secret in class, he inadvertently sets off a chaotic chain of events that turns his mundane suburban life upside down. Winner of the Audience Award at the 2009 Tribeca Film Festival, *City Island* spins a web of misrepresentations, misinterpretations and misunderstandings into a smart and charming comedy about a family that stops at nothing to avoid the truth.

### **Au Revoir les Enfants**

**directed by Louis Malle**

The film is based on events in the childhood of the director, Louis Malle, who at age 11 was attending a Roman Catholic boarding school near Fontainebleau. One day, he witnessed a Gestapo raid in which three Jewish students and a Jewish teacher were rounded up and deported to Auschwitz. All four were gassed on arrival. The school's headmaster, Lucien Bunel - Père Jacques de Jesus, was arrested for harboring them and sent to the concentration camp at Mauthausen. He died shortly after the camp was liberated by the American Army, having refused to leave until the last French prisoner was repatriated. Forty years later, Yad Vashem granted the title Righteous Among the Nations to Père Jacques.

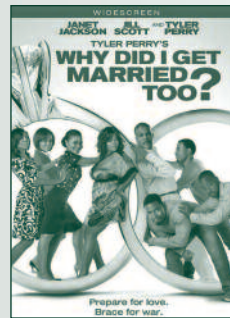

ALA PRIMA ENERGETIC PAINTINGS,  
DRAWINGS & WORKS ON PAPER

Hampton Bay's artist Lauren Chambers will exhibit a wide variety of her landscapes, still life's and figurative artwork during the month of October.



Her oil paintings, drawings and works on paper are all painted directly from life from the observation of nature in a style known as “Ala Prima Painting” or “all at once.” Simply stated, this means that the drawing and painting are done simultaneously rather than applying the paint on top of either a highly developed or less developed drawing on the canvas.

Ms. Chambers states that, “Ala Prima Painting employs a directness of brush stroke and a freshness of color which records or expresses the artist’s experience of painting on location as she is quickly responding to what is seen. The result is expressive, lively and more energetic work.”

Lauren received her BFA in Painting at the University of California at Berkley and has also studied at the California College of Arts & Crafts, National Academy of Design and the Long Island Academy of Fine Art in the atelier of Robert Armetta. She has received numerous awards while exhibiting in group and solo shows in New York and Long Island.

The art work of Lauren Chambers will be on exhibit throughout the month of October. Doreen Ceglia is Chairperson of this exhibit.
